

Project Objectives

- Meet the needs established in the 2007 Transit Oriented Development Strategy
 - Improve safety on San Leandro Blvd between Davis Street and Williams Street
 - Pedestrians Bicyclists Vehicles
 - Install on-street parking (66), bike lanes, and an improved landscaped median
 - Widen sidewalks, add sidewalk bulb-outs, improve lighting, and landscaping
 - Add a traffic signal at Parrott Street and make significant accessibility upgrades to the signals at Davis Street, West Juana Avenue, and at the BART Pedestrian crossing







Delays

- PG&E utility box adjustments
- EBMUD fire hydrant and water service installation
- BART's use of existing water meter required rework of irrigation and additional long lead time valves
- UG utility conflict between street light foundations and storm drain line





The Future



- The Cornerstone BRIDGE Housing (\$60M)
 - Construction Start Fall 2014
- San Leandro Tech Campus Phase I (\$50M)
 - Estimated Construction Start 4th Qtr 2014
- West Juana Pedestrian Improvements (\$750k grant)
 - Construction 2015
- Pavement Rehabilitation of San Leandro Blvd Williams Street to Hudson Lane (\$1.5M grant & Meas. B)
 - Construction 2015
- Improvements to the BART / AC Transit intermodal station area
 - Date to be determined
- Implementation of the Community Benefit District
