 Provide quality public safety service and grow our partnership with the community to keep San Leandro safe.

Maintain and enhance San Leandro's infrastructure.

Current System

Background:

- Installed in 1994
- Two cameras in City Hall (more added later)
- Multiple cameras at the Police Department

Analysis:

- Video quality is <u>very low</u> (not HD)
- Limited coverage
- Lacks the capability to record and store video outside of PD building
- System is outdated and end-of-life

Previous Actions:

- Finance Committee approved further discussion on December 3, 2012
- City Council received public comment and provided direction to staff on May 5, 2014

Proposed System

Benefits:

- High definition video
- Ability to record and store content
- Very high percentage of building coverage in City Hall and Police Department

Project Timeline

- Began in Oct 2012
- Project Initiation and Requirements Gathering
- Vendor Selection
- Site visits/surveys
- Budgeting
- Scope finalization
- Police Department Camera Policy
- If approved by City Council, Phase 1 is expected to begin in September, 2014 and be complete by November, 2014

Scope of Project

Phase 1:

- City Hall (First and Second Floor)
- Police Department
- City Jail

Phase 2:

Community cameras (to be brought forward in 2014)

Odin Systems

- Highly specialized knowledge in indoor/outdoor security camera systems
- Installed in Pittsburg, San Pablo, Antioch
- Integrates with existing IT infrastructure
- Only integrator of 3M fixed cameras in Northern, CA

Recommendation

 Staff recommends that the City Council approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement with Odin Systems to replace the surveillance and security camera system at the Civic Center.
