Program Overview

- "Last Mile" Transportation
- LINKS created in 2001 to provide reliable transportation from BART to employers
 - Free
 - 5:45 9:45 am / 3:00 7:00 pm (peak commute hours)
 - Monday Friday
 - Expanded to two loops in 2015
 - Four shuttles on 20 minute headways
 - Riders must be 18 or ride with an adult (special permits avail.)
- Ridership 800 rides/day (over 200,000 rides/year)
- Meets BAAQMD Transit Requirement 50+ Employees

Program Administration

• SLTMO


- City contracts with the San Leandro Transportation Management Organization (SLTMO) to administer the LINKS Shuttle Service
- SLTMO contracts with MRG for management of the LINKS and Kaiser Shuttle

BID Advisory Board

- The BID is a levied benefit assessment on businesses within the BID area through a "special election"
- Ordinance requires that BID Advisory Board annually review the LINKS performance
- Ordinance provides that the City Council may increase the annual assessment in an amount not to exceed the increase in the CPI

Program Participation

- Links serves over 600 employers and 17,000 employees
- Largest employers:
 - Paramedics Plus
 - Costco
 - Walmart
 - Kaiser exempt
- SLTMO manages the Kaiser Hospital BART Shuttle
 - 7 days per week, 365 days per year
- LINKS also serves: residents, commercial nodes (Marina Square), non-profits (DSFRC)



LINKS reduces Single Occupancy Vehicle Trips! 23% would drive alone without LINKS



Impact on Riders if LINKS were not Available...

75% - Financial Hardship

1% - Could not continue working at current location

2016 Rider Survey



Most riders are low-income (75%) Annual household income less than \$65,000 (Multi-person household)

Funding

- Business Improvement District established in 2002
- 2015 BID area expanded and BID reauthorized for 15 years with over 90% approval
- Funding:
 - BID 50%
 - Grants (Measure BB, TFCA, Lifeline)
 - Advertising (Marina Square)
 - Kaiser Shuttle Contract Fees from the Kaiser contract offset the administration costs
- Funding is stabilized for FY 2017-18

Upcoming Improvements

- Shuttle Stops at BART
 - BART is developing curb use guidelines and redesigning the bus stop area.
 - SLTMO is working with BART to secure suitable curb assignments for LINKS and the Kaiser Shuttle
 - Nextbus
 - Real time arrival and departure information through a mobile application

BID Rate Recommendation

- BID Advisory Board Recommendation:
 - Increase the BID per employee assessment rate equal to the increase in the CPI.
 - For 2018, the applicable CPI factor is 3 percent.
 - Rate Change:
 - \$22.20 to \$22.87 per employee
 - Businesses with three or fewer owner/employees, landlords, and non-profits will continue to be exempt.
 - Generates approximately \$10,000
