SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

As the Code reviewing body under the Political Reform Act, the City Council is required to review the City's Conflict of Interest Code biennially to determine whether or not an amendment to the Code is necessary. The attached draft Exhibit A makes proposed changes to the Code based on conditions occurring since the last update 2018. The attached resolution is in draft form and the Notice of Intent must be published to begin the 45-day public comment period on the proposed changes. A final version will be brought back to the Council for approval on June 7, 2021.

The proposed changes reflect title changes of positions that already exist in the code, reclassifications, vacancies, and/or the addition and deletion of positions based on an examination of their involvement in the decision making process. The changes are reflected in underline/strikeout format in the draft Exhibit A Proposed Conflict of Interest Code. The City Attorney, City Clerk and Executive Management staff reviewed the proposed changes and concur with the recommendation.

Any elected officer, employee, consultant, or other person required to file a statement of economic interests as required by Chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act may electronically file such statements using the City Clerk's online system according to procedures established by the City Clerk. These procedures shall ensure that the online system complies with the requirements set forth in Section 87500.2 of the Government Code.

RESOLUTION of the City Council for the City of San Leandro to Repeal and Reenact Chapter 4.2 of the City of San Leandro Administrative Code to Update the Conflict of Interest Code as Required by State Law

WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act of 1974 (California Government Code section 81000 *et seq.*) requires every government agency to adopt a conflict of interest code and review this code every two years; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 87500 et seq. provides that a legislative body of a local government agency may permit the electronic filing of a statement of economic interests as required by Political Reform Act Articles 2 and 3; and

WHEREAS, the software used by the City Clerk's electronic filing system, SouthTech Systems, Granicus, has been certified by the Secretary of State and meets the requirements set by Government Code Section 87500.2; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk will operate the electronic filing system in compliance with the requirements of California Government Code Section 87500.2 and any other applicable laws; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is the code reviewing body for the City of San Leandro; and

WHEREAS, the City Council reviewed the amendments to the City's conflict of interest code; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk recommends the adoption of said amendments.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of San Leandro does RESOLVE that Title 4, Chapter 2 of the City of San Leandro Administrative Code relating to the City's conflict of interest code is hereby repealed in its entirety and immediately reenacted, as provided in the copy which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

Chapter 2 **Conflict of Interest**

[Added text is shown in *italics and underscore*; deleted text is shown by strikeout.]

<u>84.2.100: LEGAL REOUIREMENT.</u> Under the Political Reform Act, California Government Code Sections 81000 et seq., all public agencies are required to adopt a conflict of interest code. This code designates positions required to file Statements of Economic Interests (Form 700), and assigns disclosure categories specifying the types of interest to be reported. TheForm 700 is a public document intended to alert public officials and members of the public to thetypes of financial interests that may create conflicts of interests.

<u>§4.2.105: ADOPTION OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE.</u> Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) Regulation 18730 in Title 2, Division 6 of the California Code of Regulations is adopted and incorporated into this Chapter by reference. FPPC Regulation 18730, together with the designated positions set forth in Appendix A and the disclosure categories set forth in Appendix B, constitutes the formation and promulgation of the City's conflict of interest code.

§4.2.110: FILING OF FORM 700. All designated officials and employees shall file the required Form 700 pursuant to provisions of this Chapter with the City Clerk, the City's filing officer either in hard copy or through the City's electronic filing system. Failure to timely file the required Form 700 may result in disciplinary action by the relevant department head and/or in the imposition of administrative, criminal, and civil sanctions as provided in California Government Code Sections 81000-91014.

PUBLIC INSPECTION AND REPRODUCTION. Every Form 700 filed **§4.2.115**: pursuant to this Chapter shall be open for public inspection and reproduction in the Office of the City Clerk during regular business hours.
