Whereas, there has been presented to this Council a certain Deed dated January 10, 1955, to a parcel of land more fully described in the said Deed to the same executed by the Foxboro Company, a corporation, to the City of San Leandro, a municipal corporation, duly acknowledged and delivered to the City of San Leandro:

Now, therefore, the City Council of the City of San Leandro does RESOLVE as follows:

That said Deed and the land therein described be and the same is hereby accepted by the said City of San Leandro upon the condition subsequent nevertheless that said street be improved by the party making said conveyance and dedication thereof without cost to the City of San Leandro.


