WHEREAS, San Leandro's diversity includes many Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Questioning/Queer (LGBTQ) individuals, couples, seniors, and their children and families; and

WHEREAS, many LGBTQ residents and seniors have provided decades of hard work to organize their communities by taking risks and making many sacrifices to pave the way for the civil rights we enjoy today; and

WHEREAS, the Lavender Seniors of the East Bay has been at the forefront in providing advocacy and education to promote broader understanding of diversity in the LGBTQ community by helping to establish greater safety and services for seniors, youth, and other residents, and has created a policy of collaborating for the betterment and improvement of society by bridging resources to fill unmet needs; and



PROCLAMATION OF THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES FOR THE CITY OF SAN LEANDRO FINDING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY AND A STATE OF EMERGENCY (COVID-19)

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 3-4-124 of the City of San Leandro empowers the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency and/or a state of emergency when said City is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity and the City Council is not in session, and;

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services of the City of San Leandro does hereby find:

That an outbreak of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) caused by the 2019 novel coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2) began in Wuhan, Hubei Province, China in December 2019, and has spread to numerous countries and territories, including the United States; and

COVID-19 is an infectious disease that causes respiratory illness. Experts anticipate that while a high percentage of individuals affected by COVID-19 will experience mild flu-like symptoms, some will have more serious symptoms and require hospitalization, particularly individuals who are elderly or already have underlying chronic health conditions.

It is imperative to prepare for and respond to suspected or confirmed COVID-19 cases, to implement measures to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, and to prepare to respond to an increasing number of individuals requiring medical care and hospitalization.

The United States Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the United States Health and Human Services Agency, the California Department of Public Health, and the Alameda County Department of Public Health are each working to monitor and plan for the potential spread of COVID-19 to support and guide local actions to preserve public health.

On January 23, 2020 the CDC activated its emergency response system to provide ongoing support for the response to COVID-19 in the United States.

On January 31, 2020, the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency for the entire United States to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to COVID-19.

On February 25, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention announced that community spread of COVID-19 is likely to occur in the United States.

On March 1, 2020, the Health Officer of Alameda County declared a public health emergency throughout the County of Alameda.

On March 4, 2020, the Governor of California proclaimed a state of emergency exists in California after making determinations that:

1. The conditions caused by COVID-19 are likely to require the combined forces of a mutual aid region or regions to appropriately respond; and

2. Local authority is inadequate to cope with the threat posed by COVID-19.

On March 12, 2020, the Alameda County Department of Public Health confirmed evidence of community-acquired transmission;

On March 13, 2020, the President of the United States of America declared a national state of emergency in response to the spread of COVID-19 within the United States of America.

On March 16, 2020, the County of Alameda announced and invoked a shelter-in-place for three weeks.

San Leandro Municipal Code section 3-4-120 designates the City Manager as the Director of Emergency Services for the City of San Leandro.

San Leandro Municipal Code section 3-4-124 authorizes the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency in the event the City Council is not in session.

San Leandro Municipal Code section 3-4-105 defines emergencies as follows:

- (a) A "local emergency" exists when duly proclaimed, where conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the territorial limits of this City are or are likely to be beyond the control on this City and require the combined forces of other political subdivisions. Such a "local emergency" may be caused by such conditions as air pollution, fire, flood, storm, epidemic, riot, drought, sudden and severe energy shortage, plant or animal infestation or disease, the Governor's warning of an earthquake or volcanic prediction, or an earthquake or other conditions, other than a labor controversy.
- (b) A "state of emergency" exists, upon proclamation by the Governor where conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the State are or are likely to be beyond the control of any single county or city and will require the forces of a mutual aid region or response. This "state of emergency" may be caused by such conditions as air pollution, fire, flood, storm, epidemic, riot, drought, sudden and severe energy shortage, plant or animal infestation or disease, the Governor's warning of an earthquake or volcanic prediction, or an earthquake, or other conditions, other than a labor controversy or a "state of war" emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, I HEREBY FIND AND DETERMINE that:

1. The Alameda County Department of Public Health has confirmed community-acquired transmission of COVID-19 in the County of Alameda;



- 2. Based on the United Statement Department of Health and Human Services declaration and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention statements, and multiple cases of COVID-19 and evidence of community-acquired transmission in the region, there is an ongoing risk and likelihood of additional COVID-19 positive patients and community spread in the County of Alameda and the City of San Leandro;
 - 3. The conditions of San Leandro Municipal Code sections 3-4-124 and 3-4-105 are met for me to proclaim the existence of a local emergency and a state of emergency in the City of San Leandro; and
 - 4. The San Leandro City Council is not in session.

NOW, BASED UPON THE FINDINGS AND DETERMINATION ABOVE, I HEREBY PROCLAIM, that a local emergency and state of emergency now exists throughout the City of San Leandro caused by an outbreak and community spread of COVID-19 in Alameda County.

BE IT FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that during the existence of such local emergency and state of emergency, the powers, functions, and duties of the emergency organization of the City of San Leandro shall be those prescribed by State law and the ordinances, resolutions, and approved plans of the City of San Leandro.
